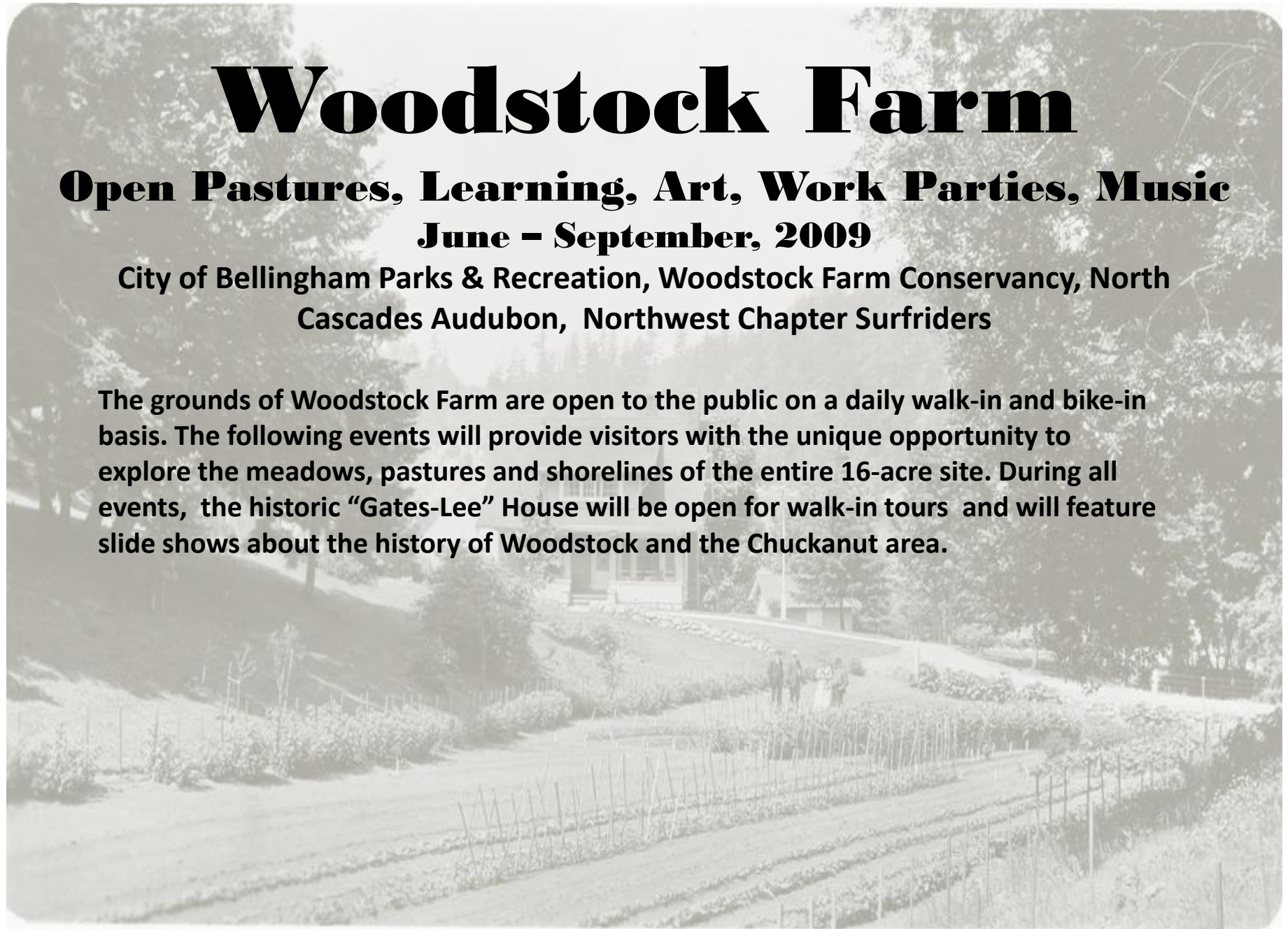


# **Woodstock Farm**

Come help remove invasive plants on the midden bank and install new fencing to protect the 3,000-year old shell midden which will provide greater public access from the shore and the water. Dr. Sarah Campbell, Dr. Bert Webber, Dr. Charles Nelson and Melissa Roberts of the Whatcom County Marine Resources Committee, will examine the midden deposits and discuss the area's prehistoric and recent shellfish populations and their current and past cultural uses. *No parking on site, park at the North Chuckanut trailhead and wait for the shuttle or take the trail to Woodstock from the trailhead parking lot. Shuttle service available from North Chuckanut Trailhead between 1 – 1:30 pm and 6:30 - 7 pm.*
