WHEREAS, today, the WSO is comprised of over 80 volunteer musicians, including local music teachers, active and retired professional musicians, and talented community members from all backgrounds; and

WHEREAS, the orchestra performs seven concerts annually at the Mount Baker Theatre, as well as performing a free family concert and providing many educational programs throughout Whatcom County; and

WHEREAS, in recognition of the contribution the volunteer players, board, staff and other volunteers have made to the arts in our community; and

WHEREAS, in 2015 the WSO celebrates its 40th anniversary season;
